#### **State Examinations**

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> year students have just finished their Pre-Mocks examinations. It is essential that homework and study patterns are maintained at a high level in the coming weeks up to the Christmas Holidays and over the holiday period in preparation for their Mock Examinations.

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Mock Examinations on the 28<sup>th</sup> January and will run for eight school days.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Year Mock Examinations will commence on the 7<sup>th</sup> February and will run for seven school days.

The fees for the Mock Examinations are €40 for Junior Cert students and €140 for Leaving Cert students. This fee can be paid in two instalments, one by 15<sup>th</sup> December and one by January 12<sup>th</sup> 2018.




Well done to the U16/U19 girls who had a great campaign this term.

# **Break time arrangements**

It is essential that students from different year groups have morning and lunch break in the areas allocated to them and refrain from entering prohibited areas. Only senior cycle students are allowed out of school at lunchtime. In the interest of Health and Safety and other reasons, students are not permitted to assemble in groups on footpaths, roads etc in the vicinity of the school. Please ensure that your son/daughter is aware of this aspect of school policy.

## **Road Safety / Parking Arrangements**

We ask all students to please exercise due caution and to use the pedestrian lights when coming to and from school. Due to Health and Safety and other concerns, can parents / guardians please refrain from driving into the school yard and please drop students outside of the school a safe distance away from the school entrances.



Car parking facilities on the school grounds are for members of staff and visitors to the school only.

#### **Communication with school**

Please ensure you contact the school office/ send a note to the school to explain any period of absence immediately before / after the period of absence

Please contact the school office/ send a note to the school if your son/ daughter (Senior Cycle only) is required to leave before the end of any school day.

Please advise the school office of any change that has taken place in relation to address or telephone numbers.

#### Uniform

After consultation with Parents, students, teachers and partners in Mountmellick Community School changes to the uniform (photos on the right) have been agreed. There will be no change to jumpers and trousers. In line with departmental advice that uniforms should not be unduly expensive all students are to wear grey shirts from September 2019. Other changes are to be rolled out incrementally as follows:



<u>1<sup>st</sup> Years September 2019:</u> Girls are to wear **plaid skirt** with grey shirt and light blue crested jumper and grey socks. Girls can wear creased trousers. Girls are to wear navy or black shoes. AV8s are allowed.

Boys are to wear grey creased trousers, grey shirt and light blue crested jumper. Boys are to wear all black or navy shoes.

 $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  Years September 2019: All must wear grey shirts. Students can wear the uniform they purchased for first year but if parents need to buy a new skirt for their daughter they should buy the new plaid skirt as the grey skirt is being phased out.

<u>T.Y and 5<sup>TH</sup> Years September 2019:</u> Girls are to wear plaid skirt with grey shirt and navy crested jumper and grey socks. Girls can wear creased trousers. Girls are to wear navy or black shoes. AV8s are permitted.

Boys are to wear grey creased trousers, grey shirt and navy jumper. Boys are to wear navy or black shoes.

 $\underline{6^{th} Years September 2019:}$  All  $6^{th}$  years must wear grey shirts. Students can wear the rest of the uniform they purchased for  $5^{th}$  year.

<u>All PE Gear:</u> P.E. students are to wear navy tracksuit bottoms and navy polo shirt. They can be plain or crested. Crested uniforms that were already purchased can be still worn.

## **Recent Developments**

- 1. We are pleased to report that we have installed a new set of computers in our ICT room. This represents part of our digital strategy as we plan for the future. This was funded by school finances and partially by an ICT grant.
- 2. We have changed the manner in which school meals are provided in our school. Currently all students who wish to avail of the service have access to tea / scones / cereals / toast /beans fruit at breaktime along with access to wraps / rolls / sandwiches / soup at lunchtime. This service is provided free of charge to our students.

  Any student who wishes to avail of a hot dinner at lunchtime can access same for a fee of 50 cent per day which is paid directly to the service provider, *Get Fresh*
